Dear Friends & Partners,

It is a great joy for me to present the Annual Report of our trust for its 27 years of official existence. First of all I wish to thank each of you who have stood with us though our thick and thins to actualize our dreams and vision during these 26 years that have gone by.

This reporting year has been the most challenging of all the years we have witnessed in our organization. Our board, together with me were determined to face the challenge of COVID 19 pandemic and serve our country and our fellow citizens when they are facing the gigantic challenge of unemployment, hunger, health issues together with many more uncertainties. As a responsible and responsive NGO, we stood together with our government, other NGOs and members of public to steer our country out of this crisis. The strong contribution that we have made may be like a drop in the ocean, but it certainly has been a life changing and life sustaining experience for the thousands whose families and lives we have been able to impact.

COVID took almost all of our attention this year. We were able to distribute dry ration to over 60,000 families throughout 16 states of North India. We fed cooked food to another thousands of migrant laborer, we also fed cooked meal for one whole month in August to few communities and hundreds of slum dwellers of Delhi. We supported hundreds of families with financial assistance and many hundreds with medical support. We have started helping the children of those whose head lost his or her life. As the pandemic and its affect continues through out the country, we are engaged in assisting more and more families together with local administration.

Before the second phase of COVID attack we were able to sink in nearly 102 handpumps in the states of Orissa, Jharkhand, UP and Madhya Pradesh together with submersible pump in many locations. During the same time we were able to start another project that is caring for the children with special needs in the slums of Delhi under our project named – Nai Roshni. Our work among the tea garden workers in Jalpaiguri district on abetting human trafficking went on and we helped many tea garden workers and their families during the COVID pandemic.

In achieving the same we could muster the support and prayers of each of you and we remain thankful to you for the same. I would also like to thank God first all and then my fellow trustees and all our committed staff, volunteers, partner NGOs, supporters, trainers and The Full Gospel Trust of India team for all their hard work.

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INTRODUCTION OF TFGTI:

The Full Gospel Trust of India is a registered charitable organization under Indian Trust Act in India. It was established in 1992, but got itself registered in 1995. It is also registered with the Home Ministry of the Government of India to receive foreign funds under the appropriate FCR Act and with the Income Tax department of the Government of India (12A & 80G) and is allotted a FCRA registration number and a Permanent Account Number (PAN). It has never been black listed, or changed its name or moved its head office but has expanded to different state offices. Its priorities and objectives have remained the same. The Full Gospel Trust of India has targeted its development efforts through projects designed to impact the lives of under privileged women, men and children. It seeks to empower women and work towards providing them with a safe and secured surrounding where their rights are not crushed and they are not abused. TFGT India places an emphasis on checking trafficking of human beings and specially girls and women and rehabilitation of victims. Top on our agenda is to make potable drinking water available to all dry and arid areas and people living there. It works in pandemic situations and on disaster relief, rehabilitation and mitigation project in various disaster-prone areas like Orissa, Bihar, Bengal, Gujarat, and Kashmir. It works for all Indians irrespective of their religious, linguistic and ethnic differences.

The Full Gospel Trust of India is committed to serve the poor and needy of India, in compliance with the SDG goals of United Nations and in a manner which is holistic.

Rev. Dr. Abraham Sahu is the Founder President of the organization. He has initiated the work from rubbles and is a highly qualified and experienced person. He is a graduate in science stream. Thereafter he pursued his master's in social work and Personnel management. He has served the World Vision of India, an international NGO for 14 years. His responsibilities included initiating, monitoring, evaluating of development programs and human recourse issues in whole of North India. He also has been a consultant to United Nations Drug Control program (UNDCP) for 5 South East Asian countries in their New Delhi office. He also holds various honorary positions in other institutions and organizations.

The organization has a large number of Full-time and part time Staff members along with many volunteers who serve the poor and marginalized people of community irrespective of their caste, creed or religion. TFG Trust is motivating and partnering with other NGOs and the Governments in uplifting the poor and marginalized. TFG Trust's relief and development programs provide a model for involvement in the development process, which is equitable, sustainable, and value based. Lately it has been involved in caring supporting victims of **COVID-19** and the migrating population in 16 North Indian states. It also assisted the victims of **Amphan** and **Fani cyclone** that devastated the landscape of Bengal and Orissa.

ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT DURING THE YEAR 2021-2022:

The ongoing activities and achievements of The Full Gospel Trust of India during this fiscal year 2021-22 have been in line with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) of the United Nations. It has been able to achieve remarkable success in its efforts to achieve the target set by its board of Trustees and within the approved budget for the year. Some of our achievements during the year is enlisted below;

A. FIGHTING POVERTY

The Full Gospel Trust of India, work towards making a multipronged attack on poverty. It equips the poor to have hands-on skill to earn a respectable living, save for future and family needs and connect them with banks and financial institutions to avail loan and start with petty businesses and expand from thereon. It engages and empowers women from the community through its Projects such as [Nari Maryada](#), [Hifazat](#) and [Nai Roshnis](#). The main aim of these projects are to empower 10000 women and their families by engaging them in Self Help Groups. More than 550 Self Help Groups have been formed under these projects and they have been synchronized with income generation programs. Under these project small loans are given to members of the groups especially the most deserving ones. The loans are thereafter repaid with low rate of interest in installments. This has been instrumental in uplifting their social and economic conditions and pull them out of the poverty situation. These projects are operational in the slums and resettlement colonies of Delhi and a host of villages in the district of Aligarh in the state of Uttar Pradesh and East Singbhum district of Jharkhand in India. In order to fight poverty it also provides rural and urban women and boys with income generation skills through impartation of various trainings so that they themselves can start some small businesses and make themselves and their families financially strong. The TFG Trust organized various Income Generation skill Trainings such as candle making, phenol making, washing powder, Vaseline making training, beauty culture, cutting and tailoring Nutrition and food making training, etc. under different projects such as [Nari Maryada](#), [Hifazat](#), [Nai Roshni](#) and [COVID Care](#). After successful trainings they avail loans and thus come out of their poverty net.

B. FIGHTING HUNGER

Our organization fights hunger that exists amidst all our target areas goes unabated. We ensure that no one (especially children) goes to bed hungry. In our efforts, we provide mid day meal to hundreds of children in various states in India, we teach their mothers to cook nutritious meal with the available items in their kitchen and with minimum expenditures. If needed we supply raw food materials to the hungry families too. More details can be found in our Project [Nai Roshni](#).



During COVID we supplied dry rations to thousands of families so that no one remains hungry. We also distributed cooked meals for one whole month to many hundreds of families and also supplied cooked meals to fleeing migrating labors More details can be found in [COVID care program](#).

C. HEALTH AND EDUCATION FOR ALL:

One of the major areas of focus of TFGTI has been education. We wish to ensure that each child is enrolled in a nearby school and those who have dropped out are assisted to continue their education and those who have not been going to school are prepared and assisted in admission in a school. Apart from this, Adult Education to men and women and Employment related trainings are provided. To carry out these activities, we have various projects running in various parts of India. The details can be found in our project titled as [a\) Nai Roshni](#), [b\) Nai Umang](#) and [Haqq project](#).

TFG Trust has been focusing on SDG Goals and among them is the work on community health and hygiene. TFG Trust has been carrying this activity for over two decades. Chief among them have been Child Survival program for Pregnant and lactating mothers, Reproductive health care for young adult girls, Immunization of children and mothers, Menstrual health care for women and girls COVID Care and Post COVID care. Our tailoring centers produce masks and sanitary pads for girls who have reached puberty. We distribute this at cost price and that is very low. Public awareness is also raised on these issues and seminars and community teachings are done too. We also focus on hygiene and sanitation matters.

Our organization also carries out health camps, health talk and regular medical check up of children then their mothers. Details of our engagement can be found in our project activities enlisted under: [a\) Nai Roshni](#) [b\) Nari Maryada](#), [c\) Hifazat](#) and [d\) Redeemed](#).

1. REPRODUCTIVE CHILD HEALTH CARE FOR GIRLS AND WOMEN:

RCH approach defined as “People have the ability to reproduce and regulate their fertility”. In this programme, women are able to go through pregnancy and child birth safely. The outcome of pregnancy is successful in terms of maternal and infant survival and well being.” Through this programme the women are assisted to lead a healthy life so that they and their babies stay healthy and live long. In this activity of ours, Pregnant and married women are given training on how a mother can stay healthy by eating healthy and nutritious food which is good for both mother and child. Special focus is given on adolescent girls through this programme, who need to be given proper education on sexual life and activities, so that in future they do not face any problem, when married. Various health talks are conducted by doctors and experts to give them knowledge on various health aspects. A special attention is given to their nutrition, vaccinations etc. Every pregnant mother and lactating mothers are under our observation till their children attain the age of 5.

2. MENSTRUAL HEALTHCARE:

The Full Gospel Trust has been focusing on Reproductive Health Care of the young and adolescent girls and women in all our target areas for last many years. From this year, and even during the pandemic, we have started making sanitary pads for girls and women at a very low cost through our SHGs and making it available to all women and girls that need it and that to an affordable rate. This is inculcating in women and girls a hygienic living condition.

3. HEALTH CAMPS:

TFGTI, from last many years have been engaged in conducting regular health camps in rural and urban India. These camps are organized in order to create a healthy lifestyle among the community. Around 3 health Camps have been organized this year in the before the COVID struck the nation. These health camps were organized to provide health services on gynae, eye, dental HIV, and cancer care. Health Checkups by qualified doctors are held on weekly basis and medicines are distributed free of cost to all who come for check up. TFG Trust also have been organizing comprehensive health information dissemination programmes, to impart health education and sensitize communities on various preventive and curative health care including COVID CARE.

D. CHILD DEVELOPMENT

Children are the future of any nation. We therefore pay a lot of attention to Children and their holistic growth. Our main focus is on the education and health and career guidance of children in our target areas.

1. EDUCATION FOR ALL:

We ensure that no children in our target area stay unschooled or remain a dropout. We chiefly focus on girl children. In order to achieve our goal, we carry out preparatory classes for children who do not go to school or are getting ready to go to a school. We visit houses and identify such children and bring them to our center and prepare them for school enrollment. We contact with the local schools and enroll children there after fulfilling all the requirements. We also guide children about their careers and invite experts to guide them from their early school days. We also care for children with special needs and like those affected by CP, Autism and other forms of disability. We have special classes for them.

In addition to the above, we provide mid-day meals for children to ensure they are not malnourished. We measure their height and weight and monitor progress. Apart from these, various nutritional camps are organized to sensitize the community about nutrition and mal nourishment related issues. Thousands of children benefited out of it and did not go to bed empty stomach. We need to work more in this field. All these activities are carried out in our project entitled [Nai Roshni](#) and [Hifazat](#).

2. COMPUTER EDUCATION:

The Full Gospel Trust besides emphasizing on secular education, also gives importance to education that is related to income and employment generation, such as computer education for children as well as youth. TFG Trust is running various computer centers for the benefit of residents of Suraj Park, Badli, Raja Vihar in Delhi. TFG Trust is looking forward to make the children and women computer literate. Rehma Computer Center of TFG Trust is a center which provides computer skills to the children from the slum that are basically school dropout boys and girls. There are few circumstances where these boys and girls have not been able to complete their school education for various reasons. TFGTI after making a survey have identified these boys and girls who have interest to take computer training.

We provide the basis course skills training such as Typing, MS office, MS Paint so that they get the basic knowledge of computer and its functions and operating system. This makes them competent to look for some job in future and earn a decent earning for themselves and their families. All boys and girls get a proper certificate on the completion of their course.



3. VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER (VTC) CUTTING & TAILRING, BEAUTICIAN:

These two programmes were carried out during the lean period of COVID pandemic and it targeted towards the underprivileged children, girls and women from different slums of Delhi. The vocational training center is developed by keeping abreast with the latest market where the students are given training on different vocational trainings. The women are given training on tailoring, beauty culture, so that they can become self-independent and can run their own business of tailoring institute or a boutique or a beauty parlor. A total of 20 students have been trained in tailoring and around 10 students have been trained in beautician course during the reporting period. Our focus is that to empower girls as well as housewives and also boys and youth to get the basic Income generation skills so that they become competent to get some small job or get some hands-on skill and earn a respectable income for themselves and their.



E. CLEAN WATER AND W.A.S.H

Water is one of the basic needs for every human being. But India is facing the worst water crisis in its history. Nearly 600 million people are affected each year. The acute shortage of water for daily needs of masses has prompted our organizations to take stringent measures to combat the problem. **“SAFE WATER AND SAVE WATER”** Program aims at raising up of drinking water storage cum distribution centers and capacity-building training for its maintenance across dry and arid regions of various states in India. The objectives of such programs are to provide fresh drinking water to families and communities and this is best done by digging bore wells so that people will have round the clock availability of fresh water. This also reduces water



borne diseases as well as anemia in women, children and adults among other.

In recent past the Trust has been able to carry out the following;

- a. Install two 2000 litre tanks with Water purifiers in two places in Kathmandu, Nepal,
- b. Install five numbers of 2000 litre tanks with Water purifiers at Titlagarh, Kalahandi, Orissa, Dooars in Jalpaiguri, W. Bengal and two in Delhi slums
- c. Dug nearly 50 bore-wells as well as hand pumps with submersible pumps even during COVID in Madhya Pradesh, Varanasi, Orissa and Jharkhand.

While installing hand pumps, TFGTI has equipped, trained and empowered the local community to maintain these on their own and for their future use.



E. THE SAFETY, DIGNITY AND EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN:

The Indian women have been vying for a respectable and dignified position in their families and community where her voice will be valued and appreciated. She wants to live a life without fear - fear of being abused, raped or trafficked for obvious reasons. To help women achieve their dream and desires, the TFGTI has been engaged in ensuring a safe, dignified and respectable life for each women.



To this end it has been educating them

and creating legal awareness amongst them so that they know and exercise their rights and are no more abused or allured into trafficking. Various projects have been put in place to actualize it. This is achieved though our [Nari Maryada Project](#).



G. FIGHT HUMAN TRAFFICKING:

TFG Trust has been engaged in creating awareness amongst women, young girls and members of public on the danger and evil consequence of Human Trafficking. Human Trafficking abounds in and around the tea gardens in the Jalpaiguri and Darjeeling districts of north Bengal as well as in the tribal belt of Simdega in Jharkhand. Our organization is engaged in educating people on how to safe guard their young and adult girls and boys. This is done through public meetings, display of IEC materials, house to house awareness and street plays. We also engage religious leaders to educate their congregations about the ills of such trafficking. The result of our intervention has been very encouraging and we are able to note the result.



Our future plan is to expand our awareness scheme and cover more areas in partnership with other NGOs and the government schemes in these states in India. We also look forward to rescue and rehabilitate the victims in the days to come. More details of our intervention can be found in the details of [The Redeemed Project](#).

H. CLIMATE ACTION AND MITIGATING DISASTER AND COVID CARE:

For over two decades TFGTI has been actively engaged in national emergencies, be it natural or man-made calamities. It has risen to the occasion and assisted millions of victims with emergency needs and thereafter in rehabilitating them. It is also working towards mitigating the same. In this reporting period India suffered from the COVID 19 pandemic The second wave or COVID spread rapidly and took the entire country in its grip. On 25 March, 2021 India announced that a new variant of the coronavirus had been detected from samples collected from different states. It is the worst ever and has taken the entire country in its grip 2.5 Crore had been infected and nearly 2.75 lakh deaths. Responding to this great challenge, TFGI has started distributing a) Dry ration of one month to thousands of families, b) Provided medical kits to check the spread and contain the infection, c) Provided financial assistance to cash help to people in need of medical care in hospitals and at homes. D) Provided financial assistance many families including those that lost one or more members of their families, D) Provided small business funds to hundreds of families, E) Provided hands on training to many women so that they can earn and support their families during this tough times, F) Provided financial support to carry out the last rites of those who were deceased, G). It is also giving Our target is to assist at least 5000 families in various states of India.



BUILD PARTNERSHIPS FOR ACHIEVING THE GOALS OR NETWORKING: NETWORKING AND ADVOCACY:

TFG Trust of India works hand in hand with other GOs/NGOs and work in a planned and effective way for the development of any community and the country as a whole. The TFG Trust enjoys a very healthy relationship with the local bodies and all GOs, NGOs, International NGOs and world bodies. During this reporting year it has worked together and by connecting with 15 local and national NGOs on issues of national concerns. TFG Trust has always stood for the voiceless, the oppressed and weaker section of the community. The TFG Trust plays the role of advocates to support the cause of women, children and issues that affects the lives and working of people of India in general.



IN THIS REPORTING YEAR, APART FROM COVID CARE, WE HAVE CARRIED OUT SOME OF THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS TO ACHIEVE THE ABOVE S.D.G GOALS IN THE COUNTRY OF INDIA.

1. THE REDEEMED – (A PROJECT TO FIGHT HUMAN TRAFFICKING)

Moved by the high number of trafficking of women and girls from the tea gardens and tribal belts of India - as well as Indo-Nepal border, our ministry leadership decided to be engaged in abating this crime. As a first step, we desired to create awareness among people before taking further steps to rescue and rehabilitate such victims in our centers in North Bengal, Jharkhand and Delhi.

“Project Redeemed” has therefore been launched on 15 October, 2020 at New Glencoe tea garden in Jalpaiguri District in North Bengal, India. The aim of the project is ZERO TRAFFICKING In and around this tea gardens.

This project chiefly focuses on creating awareness amongst women, young girls and members of public. This is done in and around the tea gardens in the Jalpaiguri and Darjeeling districts of north Bengal.



The awareness is generated in two parts. First is through raising public awareness campaigns. These are held regularly, wherein large public meetings, sports events, cultural programs like dance, skits and street plays are conducted wherein a minimum of 200 to 300 people gather in each meetings. The topics include Current threat and how the trafficking takes place and how one can stay careful and safe, Role and manner in which touts play vital role in trafficking, Common traps of human trafficking, Basic knowledge of constitutional rights of each citizen, Various legislations regarding human trafficking, how to seek and obtain help from the local gram panchayat leaders and police station. To spread awareness among the young girls, the project organizes girls football tournament from time to time and among 10-15 teams from various tea gardens in the vicinity. Over 500 players and spectators gather to watch such matches and that becomes a good opportunity to discuss trafficking issue before the game started. In all these meetings the police personnel, lawyers and other NGO leaders serve as resource persons together with the project leaders. All awareness programs are attended by various leaders such as the village heads, committee members of tea gardens, the panchayat members, the Block Development officer and the tea estate manager and the senior police officers of the local police station.

The second approach is through educating and raising awareness among the various religious leaders so that they educate their congregations and their families about the ills and consequences of trafficking.

In future we seek to rescue and rehabilitate the victims, place them in our proposed mid-way homes and rehabilitate them and ensure their complete social integration. This is a giant leap that we wish to take and for this we solicit your support

2. NARI MARYADA (PROJECT AIMING AT RESTORATION OF DIGNITY OF WOMEN AND ENSURING THEIR SAFETY):

This project has been launched by the Full Gospel Trust to empower and educate the girls and women living in the rural villages and urban cities including slums of various metropolis. This projects aims at instilling in the hearts and minds of women and girl children, self-confidence and a sense of safety and freedom where they experience no physical, mental or sexual abuse whether be it at home or outside and live a life without fear and with the confidence that they possess for the good of their families and the communities in which they live. To this end the project educates, equips and enables them to protect themselves and also prepare themselves to be partakers in the process of decision making at their own families and also contribute to the family income by joining SHG groups and learning IG skills and starting petty businesses through linkages with banks and micro finance schemes . These ensures good health and education of the children of these women.

Project Goals of Nari Maryada includes creation of awareness about the civil and legal rights of women and girls in Delhi slums, protection of women from domestic violence, rape, and other atrocities unleashed on them, to form Basti Mahila Suraksha Samitis (Committees for the protection of women in the community) for ensuring sanitation, good health, improved employability as well as greater and lasting safety and security of women. The women volunteers



of BMSS own responsibilities on their own and act like watch dogs for their fellow women and girls in the vicinity. to ensure that each girl above 10 years of age knows how to protect herself and handle a situation where her safety is challenged. Through education and awareness ensure that men and young boys develop a sense of responsibility towards the opposite sex in their role as a father, brother and a good neighbour., to

network with other NGOs and government departments and work towards the sustainability of the project. The resulting effect can be gauged by the reduction in cases of wife battering and other forms of abuse and incest and cases of rapes and molestation in the communities and the improved quality life of people living in the slums and villages of Delhi and else where

3. NAI ROSHNI PROJECT

The Project Nai Roshni (New Ray of light) was initiated on 27th September, 2020 and during the Covid times. When our team noticed a number of children living in the 4 slums of Delhi, suffering from various disabilities like Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Hearing, speaking and visual disability as well as motorcade cases. However later on we brought our entire education program for children under this banner This project at present caters to the following programs;

1. SPECIAL EDUCATION CLASSES FOR THE DIFFERENTLY ABLED:

This project has children from Delhi slums and those with various learning disabilities and physical disabilities. They face problems in studies, communication or behavior. We assist these children with their ability to read, write, count numbers or apprehending gestures and information. We also ensure that all of them have their disability certificates and living allowances that the government is giving to all such children. We also provide therapeutical intervention for all who have CP or Autism etc.



2. FIGHTING HUNGER AND MALNOURISHMENT AMONG CHILDREN AND WOMEN: The aggressively fights against hunger and malnourishment among children and pregnant mothers

in these slums. BMI of children is monitored for each child in the program (including the ones with special needs). They are provided with nutritious meal each day and their parents are taught about its importance and how they must prepare such meals at home for their wards. Children belonging to the project are taught etiquette, manners and given mouth wash, body wash, hair done and if needed a shower so that they learn and get used to hygienic living standards. Apart from these we are focusing on health, immunization and nutrition of 100 pregnant and lactating mothers. We have feeding program for them and during such time we educate them on importance of health, hygiene and nutritional level in each woman throughout their pregnancy and beyond.

3. TOTOAL LITERACY AND EMPLOYABILITY FOR ALL CHILDREN IN DELHI SLUMS: This project works to ensure that all the slum dwellers are educated, be they adults or children and that they are employable. A special attention is paid to girl children.

(a) Special Tutorial classes are held for academic weak children on a daily basis where they are assisted with their school assignments and also in the subjects they feel weak. This boosts their confidence and they are able to achieve good results in their respective classes.

(b) Classes for School drop outs are conducted in our Centre and every attempt is made to readmit these dropout children in the regular school and ensure that they complete their schooling, and

(c) Adult education classes: for those who have never gone to school but are of age now. These classes are held at the locations of the learners and they are made functionally literate and know the 3Rs of Education i.e., Read, write and recite.

(d) Computer Training: Children are taught how to operate computer and learn various programs that generally boosts their capacity and makes them more advanced in their scholastic achievements and employability

(e) Training in Tailoring and embroidery skills: Adolescent Girls and women from the communities are trained in the skill of tailoring and embroidery and are awarded a certificate which enables them to start businesses from their homes and also save a lot of money by stitching clothes of their own family members.

(e) Training in Beauty Parlor management: Adolescent Girls and women from the communities are also trained in the skill of running beauty parlor businesses by learning the skill. On completion of their training, they are awarded a certificate which enables them to start businesses from their homes and also increases their chances of being employed at various parlors.

The staff of the project visit the slums on regular basis to develop rapport and motivate these families to join our education and health programs and other matters including their economic welfare and safety.

This Nai Roshni Project wishes to expand its sphere of influence to other slums of Delhi in order to change the living conditions of slum dwellers.

4. HAQQ (right):

The project Haqq is specially designed to address the needs of the Banjara community (the migrating community) in Uttar Pradesh state of India and especially in the four districts of Hathras, Aligarh, Mathura and Agra . The Banjara community children are less literate but the community has various hands-on skills. So the project is working towards educating the unschooled and the drop out children of the community. It is forming Self Help Groups in all these four districts and creating bank linkages for the community to start some business where they master the skill. The community finds market for the same. These members of the community are assisted to fight back their rights for a dignified and respectable living for themselves and their families.

The project seeks to expand its base to other Banjara communities in this state and outside whereby each family will enjoy a dignified life in the country and their migration will be restricted and stopped.

All these activities have made it possible for TFGTI to reach hundreds and thousands of children, men, women, youth, elders to empower them and bring them up from below the poverty line by “ENSURING SMILE ON EVERY FACE”
