These projects complimented the global SDG goal. In achieving the same we could muster the support and prayers of each of you and we remainthankful to you for the same.

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INTRODUCTION OF TFGTI:

The Full Gospel Trust of India is a registered charitable organization under the Indian Trust Act in of India. It was established in 1992 but got itself registered in 1995. It is also registered with the Income Tax department of the Government of India (12A & 80G) and is allotted a Permanent Account Number (PAN). It is also affiliated with the Home Ministry of the Government of India to receive foreign funds under the appropriate FCR Act and FCRA registration number has also been allotted to it. We have never been blacklisted, changed our name, or moved our head office but have expanded to different state offices. Its priorities and objectives have remained the same. The Full Gospel Trust of Indiahas targeted its development efforts through projects designed to impact the lives of underprivileged women, men, and children. It seeks to complement SDG goals and work hand in hand with others. The organization has a large number of Full-time and part-time Staff members along with many volunteers who serve the poor and marginalized people of the community irrespective of their caste, creed, or religion. TFG Trust is motivating and partnering with other NGOs and Governments in uplifting the poor and marginalized. TFG Trust's relief, rehabilitation and developmentprograms provide a model for involvement in the development process, which is equitable, sustainable, and value-based.

The Full Gospel Trust of India is committed to serving the poor and needy of India, in compliance with the SDG goals of the United Nations and in a manner that is holistic.

The Full Gospel Trust of India is determined and committed to serving the people of India together with the state and central government and "*ENSURING SMILE ON EVERY FACE"* It works for all Indians irrespective of their religious, linguistic, and ethnic differences.

Rev. Dr. Abraham Sahu is the Founding President and National Director of the organization. He has initiated thework from rubbles and is a highly qualified and experienced person. He is a graduate in the science stream. Thereafter he pursued his master's in social work and Personnel management. He has served the World Vision of India, an international NGO for 14 years. His responsibilities included initiating, monitoring, and evaluating development programs and human resource issues in the whole of North India. He also has been a consultant to United Nations Drug Control Program (UNDCP) for 5 South East Asian countries in their New Delhi office. He also holds various honorary positions in other institutions and organizations.

Ongoing Projects:

The ongoing activities and achievements of The Full Gospel Trust of India during this fiscal year **2022-23** have been in line with the **Sustainable Development Goals (SDG)** of the United Nations. It has been able to achieve remarkable success in its efforts to achieve the target set by its board of Trustees and within the approved budget for the year. Some of our achievements during the year is enlisted below;

A. FIGHTING POVERTY:

The Full Gospel Trust of India works towards making a multipronged attack on poverty. It equips the poor to have the hands-on skill to earn a respectable and dignified living, savefor their future and family needs, and connect them withbanks and financial institutions to avail loans and start petty businesses and expand from thereon. It also engages and empowers women from various communities through its Projects such as Nari Maryada, Hifazat, Haqq, Nai Umang, Redeemed, Post Covid Care and Nai Roshni. The main aim of these projects is to empower 10,000 women and their families by engaging them in Self Help Groups. More than 200 Self Help Groups have been formed this year under these projects and they have been synchronized with income generation programs. Under these projects, small loans are given to members of the groups, especially the most deserving and vulnerable ones. These projects are operational in the slums and resettlement colonies of Delhi and a host of villages in the district of Aligarh in the state of Uttar Pradesh, the slums of Delhi and East Singbhum district of Jharkhand state in India.

In order to fight poverty, our trust also provides rural and urban women, girls and boys with income generation skills through the impartation of various skill training so that they themselves can start some petty businesses and make themselves and their families financially strong. The TFG Trust conducted various Income Generation skill Training such as candle making, phenol making, washing powder, Vaseline making training, beauty culture, cutting and tailoring Nutrition and spice making training, etc.. After







successful training, they avail loans to start businesses and come out of the poverty net.

B. FIGHTING HUNGER:

Our organization continues to fight hunger that exists in all our target areas . We ensure that no one (especially children) go to bed hungry. In our efforts to fight hunger, we provide mid- day meals to hundreds of children in various states in India, we teach their mothers to cook a nutritious meal with the available items within their reach and budget. If needed we supply raw food materials



to hungry families too. More details can be found in ourProject Nai Roshni and Hifazat.





C. HEALTH AND EDUCATION FOR ALL:

One of the major areas of focus of TFGTI has been education. We wish to ensure that each child is enrolled in a nearby school and those who have dropped out are assisted to continue their education. Apart from this, Adult Education for men and women and Employment related training is provided to the aspirants. To carry out these activities, we have various projects running in various parts of India. The details can be found in our project titled a) Nai Roshin, b) Nai Umang, c) Hifazat and Haqqproject. These are carried out in the states of UP, Delhi, Jharkhand and Bihar.

TFG Trust has been focusing on SDG Goals and one of our focus area is the work on community health and hygiene. TFG Trust has been carrying this activity for over two decades. Chief among them have been the Child Survival program for Pregnant and lactating mothers, Reproductive health care for young adult girls, Immunization of children and mothers, Menstrual health care for women and girls and Post COVID care. Our tailoring centers make sanitary pads for girls and women who have reached puberty, but are not using the same. We distribute this at cost price and that is very low and affordable for all. Public awareness is also raised on these issues and seminars and community teachings are carried out too. We also focus on hygiene and sanitation matters.



Our organization also carries out health camps, health talks, and regular medical checks of children and their mothers. Details of our engagement can be found in our project activities enlisted under a) Nai Roshni, b) Nari Maryada, c) Hifazat and d) Redeemed.





WOMEN:

Our organization follows RCH approach which is defined as "People have the ability to reproduce and regulate their fertility". in this program, women are able to go through

pregnancy and childbirth safely. The outcome of pregnancy is successful in terms of maternal and infant survival and wellbeing." Through this program of ours, women are assisted to lead a healthy life so that they and their babies stay healthy and live longer. In this activity of ours, Pregnant and married women are given training on how a mother can stay healthy by eating healthy and nutritious food which is good for bothmother and child. Special focus is



given to adolescent girls through this program, who need tobe given proper education on sexual life and activities so that in the future they do not face any problems when married. Various health talks are conducted by doctors and experts to impart knowledge on various health aspects. Special attention is given to their nutrition, vaccinations, etc. Every pregnant mother and lactating mother is under our observation till their children attain the age of 5.

In the field of menstrual health care, our projects have started making sanitary pads for girls and women at a very low cost through our SHGs and making them available to all women and girls that need them at an affordable rate, both in cities and villages of India. This is inculcating in women and girls a hygienic living condition.



2. HEALTH CAMPS:

TFGTI, for the last many years, has been engaged in conducting regular health camps in rural and urban India. These camps are organized in order to address the health needs of the community and also create a healthy lifestyle amongst the women living in the community. Around 8 health Camps have beenorganized this year, mostly in Jharkhand to benefit thousands of women and girl children as well men. These health camps were organized to provide health





services on gynae, eye, dental HIV/AIDS, and cancer care. Medicines were

distributed free of cost to all who come for check-ups. TFG Trust also has been organizing comprehensive health information dissemination programs that are aimed at imparting health education to sensitize communities on various preventive and curative healthcare issues

D. CHILD DEVELOPMENT

Children are the future of any nation. We, therefore, pay a lot of attention to Children and



their holistic growth. Our main focus is on the education and health and career guidance of children in our target areas.

1. EDUCATION FOR ALL:

We ensure that none of the children in our target area stay unschooled or

remain as a dropout. We chiefly focus on girl children. In order to achieve our goal, we carry out preparatory classes for children who do not go to school or are getting ready to go to school. We visit houses and identify such children and bring them to our center and prepare them for school enrollment at the right age. We contact the local schools



about their careers and invite experts to guide them from their early school days. In addition to the above, we provide mid-day meals for children to ensure they are not malnourished. We measure their height and weight and monitor their progress. Apart from these, various nutritional camps are organized to sensitize the community about nutrition and malnourishment-related issues. Thousands of children benefited from it and did not go to bed empty stomach. In this reporting year our engagement have been in the state of Bihar, UP, Delhi and Jharkhand. We are coveing nearly 1000 children from slums and villages of India. We need to work more in this field. All these activities are carried out in our project entitled Nai Roshni, Haqq, Nai Umang and Hifazat projects.

2. COMPUTER EDUCATION AND SKILL TRAINING:

The Full Gospel Trust besides emphasizing secular education also gives importance to education that is related to income and employment generation, such as computer education for children as well as youth. TFG Trust is running various computer centre for the benefit of residents of Suraj Park in Delhi. TFG Trust is looking forward to making the children and women computer literate. Rehma Computer Center of TFG Trust is a centre that provides computer skills to children from slum that are basically school dropouts boys andgirls. We provide basic course skills training such as Typing, MS Office, MS Paint so that they get the basic knowledge of computerand its functions and operating system. This



makes them competent to look for some job in the future and earn a decent earning for themselves and their families. All boys and girls get aproper certificate on the completion of their course.

3. VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER (VTC) CUTTING & TAILORING, BEAUTICIAN:

These two programs provide training to various underprivileged children, girls, and women from different slums of Delhi. At these vocational training centers students are given training on different vocations such as training on tailoring, and beauty culture so that they can become independent and can run their own business tailoring institute or a boutique or a beauty parlor. A total of 45 students have been trained in tailoring and around 20 students have been trained in beautician courses during the reporting period. Our focus is to empower girls as well as housewives and also boys and youth to get the basic Income generation skills so that they become competent to get somesmall job or get some hands-on skills and earn a respectable income for themselves and their families.





E. CLEAN WATER AND W.A.S.H:



The TFG Trust in its **"SAFE WATER AND SAVE WATER"** Program aims at providing fresh drinking water to families and communities and this is best done by digging bore wells so that people will have round-theclock availability of fresh water. We fix submersible pump in each the wells that are dug. This also reduces waterborne diseases as well as anemia in women, children, andadults among others.

In the recent past the Trust has been able to install hand pumps, TFGTI has also equipped, trained, and empowered the local community maintain these on their own and for their future use

F: THE SAFETY, DIGNITY AND EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN:

Indian women question their safety in our nation. To help women achieve their dream and desires, the TFGTI has been engagedin ensuring a safe, dignified, and respectable life for each woman. To this end, it has been educating them and creating legal awareness amongst them so that they know and exercise their rights and are no more abused or face domestic violence. Various projects have been putin place to actualize it. This is achieved through our Nari Maryada Project which works hand in hand with the Delhi Police and the DLSA or the District Legal Service Authority that are in each District courts. The project also also associated with the Delhi Women Counchil and Child Welfare councils.



G: FIGHT HUMAN TRAFFICKING:



TFG Trust has been engaged in creating awareness among women, young girls, and members of the public regarding the danger and evil consequences of Human Trafficking. Human Trafficking abounds in and around the tea gardens in the Jalpaiguri and Darjeeling districts of north Bengal as well as in the tribal belt of Simdega in Jharkhand. Our organization



engaged in educating is communities how on to safeguard their young and adult girls and boys. This is done through public meetings, the display of IEC materials, houseto-house awareness, and street plays. The result of our intervention has been very encouraging and we are able to observe the result. Our future

plan is to expand our awareness scheme and cover more areas in partnership with other NGOs and government schemes in these states in India. We also look forward to rescuing and rehabilitating the victims in the days to come. More details of our intervention can be found in the details of The Redeemed Project.

H: CLIMATE ACTION AND MITIGATING DISASTER AND COVID CARE:

For over two decades, TFGTI has been actively engaged in national emergencies, be they natural or man-made calamities. It has risen to the occasion and assisted millions of victims with

emergencyneeds and thereafter in rehabilitating them. It is also working towards mitigating the same. TFG Trust during this reporting year stood together with the hundreds of families who were affected by the sudden flood of Subarnarekha river in Jamshedpur region of the state of Jharkhand. We supplied dry ration to each family and materials to construct their damaged homes.



TFGI continued to provide financial assistance to many families including those that lost one or more members of their families due to COVID pandamic., it provided small business funds to hundreds of families, These families have been able to come out of their situated We have assisted people with Kirana shops, piggery, poultry and goattery programs.

E. BUILD PARTNERSHIPS FOR ACHIEVING THE GOALS OR NETWORKING:

NETWORKING AND ADVOCACY:

TFG Trust of India works hand in hand with other GOs/NGOs and works in a planned and effective way for the development of any community and the country as a whole. The TFG Trust enjoys a very healthy relationship with the local bodies and allGOs, NGOs, International NGOs, and world bodies. During this reporting year it has worked together and by connecting with various local and national NGOs on issues of national concern. TFG Trust has always stood for the voiceless, the oppressed, and the weaker section of the community. The TFG Trust plays the role of advocates to support the cause of women, children and issues thataffects the lives and working of people of India in general.



IN THIS REPORTING YEAR, WE HAVE CARRIED OUT THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS TO ACHIEVE THE ABOVE S.D.G GOALS IN THE COUNTRY OF INDIA.

1. THE REDEEMED: (A project to fight Human Trafficking)

In India, there are innumerable cases of trafficking of women and girls. These are taking place in the tea gardens and tribal belts - as well as the Indo-Nepal border. Our ministry leadership has decided to be engaged in abating this crime. We create awareness among people beforetaking further steps to rescue and rehabilitate such victims in our centers in North Bengal, Jharkhand, and Delhi.

"Project Redeemed" has therefore been launched. The aim of the project is ZERO TOLERANCT TO TRAFFICKING In and around these tea gardens in Bengal and also in the simdega district of Jharkhand state in india. This project chiefly focuses on creating awareness amongst women, young girls, and members of the public.



The awareness is generated in two parts. The first is through raising public awareness campaigns. These are held regularly, wherein large public meetings and street plays that are conducted wherein a minimum of 200 to 300 people gather



in each meeting. The topics include Current threats andhow the trafficking takes place and how one can stay careful and safe, the Role and manner in which touts play a vital role in trafficking, Common traps of human trafficking, Basic knowledge of the constitutional rights of each citizen, Various legislations regarding human trafficking, how to seek and obtain help from the local gram panchayat leaders and police station.

In all these meetings the police personnel, lawyers, and other NGO leaders serve as resource persons together with the project leaders. All awareness programs are attended by various leaders such as the village heads, committee members of tea gardens, the panchayat members, the Block Development Officer and the tea estate manager and the senior police officers of the local police station.

In the future, we seek to spread the awareness into various other districts of Jharkhand and also torescue and rehabilitate the victims, place them in our proposed midhomes and rehabilitate them and ensure their complete social integration. This is a giant leapthat we wish to take and this, we solicit your support.



2. Nari Maryada: (Project aiming at the restoration of the Dignity of Women and ensuring their safety):

This ongoing project of the Full Gospel Trust works to empower and educate the girls and women living in rural villages and urban cities including slums of various metropolis. This projectaims at instilling in the hearts and minds of women and girl children, self-confidence and a sense



of safety and freedom so that they experience no physical, mental, or sexual abuse whether be it at home or outside, and live a life without fear and with the confidence. To this end, the project educates, equips, and enables them to protect themselves and also prepare themselves to be partakers in the process of decision-

making in their own families and also contribute to the family income by joining SHG groups and learning IG skills and starting petty businesses through linkages with banks and microfinance schemes. This also ensures good health and education of the children of these women.

Project Goals of Nari Maryada include the creation of awareness about the civil and legal rights

of women and girls in Delhi slums, protection of women from domestic violence, rape, and other atrocities unleashed on them, to form Basti Mahila Suraksha Samitis (Committees for the protection of women in the community) for ensuring sanitation, good health, improved employability as well as greater and lasting safety and security of women. The women volunteers of BMSS own responsibilities on their own and act like watchdogs for their fellow women and girls in the vicinity. to ensure that each girl above 10 years of age knows how to protect herself and handle a situation where



her safety is challenged. These are trained by the Delhi Police and on completion of their training, they are awarded with a certificate from Delhi Police. Education and awareness ensure that men and young boys develop a sense of responsibility towards the opposite sex in their role as a father, brothers, and good neighbors., to network with other NGOs and government departments and work towards the sustainability of the project. The resulting effect can be gauged by the reduction in cases of wifebattering and other forms of abuse and incest and cases of rapes and molestation in the communities and the improved quality of life of people living in the slums and villages of Delhi and elsewhere.

3. NAI ROSHNI PROJECT

The Project Nai Roshni (New Ray of light) is created with the objective to educate and help children living in Delhi's slums to lead fulfilling life and shape their lives and futures to achieve success in life. Especially for those people who are from economically backward and uncared for section. This project ensures that no child and women are malnourished, especially pregnant and lactating mothers and their babies. This project at present caters to the following programs:



A. FIGHTING HUNGER AND MALNOURISHMENT AMONG CHILDREN AND WOMEN:

The project works for fights against hunger and malnourishment among children and pregnant

They are provided with a nutritious meal each day and their parents are taught about its importance and how they must prepare such meals at home for their wards. Children belonging to the project are taught etiquette, and manners and given mouthwash, body wash, hair done, and if needed a shower so thatthey learn and get used to hygienic living standards.Apart from these, we are focusing on the health,

immunization, and nutrition of 100 pregnant and lactating mothers are also ensured through the various activities of the project. We have a feeding programfor them and during such time, we educate them on the importance of health, hygiene, and nutritional level in each woman throughout their pregnancy and beyond.

B. TOTAL LITERACY AND EMPLOYABILITY FOR ALL CHILDREN IN DELHI SLUMS:

This project works to ensure that all the slum dwellers as well as children in the remote villages of UP and Bihar and Jharkhand are educated, be they adults or children, and that they are employable. Special attention is paid to girl children.

(a) Special Tutorial classes are held for academically weak children on a daily basis where they are assisted with their school assignments and also in the subjects, in which they feel weak. This



boosts their confidence and they are able to achieve good results in their respective classes.

(b) Classes for School **dropouts** are conducted in our Centre and every attempt is to make to readmit these dropout children in regular school and ensure that they complete their schooling.

(c) Adult education classes for those who have never gone to school but are of age now. These classes are held at the locations of the learners and they are made functionally literate and know the 3Rs of Education i.e., Read, write and recite.

(d) : Preparatory classes: The project also encourages parents to send their children between the age group of 4-5 to send to the centre where they are prepared to be enrolled in a school in the new school session.

(e) Computer Training: Children are taught how to operate a computer and learn various programs that generally boost their capacity and make them more advanced in their scholastic achievements and employability.



(f) Training in Tailoring and embroidery skills: Adolescent Girls and women from the communities are trained in the skill of tailoring and embroidery and are awarded a certificate

that enables them to start businesses from their homes and also save a lot of money by stitchingclothes of their own family members.

(g)Training in Beauty Parlor management: Adolescent Girls and women from the communitiesare also trained in the skill of running beauty parlor businesses by learning the skill. On completion of their training, they are awarded a certificate that enables them to start businesses from their



homes and also increases their chances of being employed at various parlors.

The staff of the project visit the slums on regular basis to develop rapport and motivate these families to join our education and health programs and other programs that aim at their economic advancements and welfare and safety. Our target area covers the slums of Delhi, namely Surajpark, khadda Basti, Badli and Sector 26, R%ohini. In UPc we cover the villages of Aligarh district and in Bihar Nalanda and Arrah districts.

This Nai Roshni Project wishes to expand its sphere of influence to other slums of Delhi and villages elsewhere in order to change the living conditions and education standards of children in India.

- 4. CHILDSTAR PROJECT : This project supports the school education fee and nutritional supplements tonearly 25 children who are very needy and whose parents cannot afford their school fees. They are given nutritious meals, fruits, and milk each day. We guide them in their future career selection so that they become a worthy citizen of India when they grow up. These children hail from Delhi, Haryana, Chandigarh
- 5. SWABALAMBAN PROJECT: This project is designed for people and their families who are



severely affected by the impact of COVID-19. Some 81 families are assisted with working capital to start small businesses to support their families in this crisis hour. The trade taken up by these families includes small shops, piggery, poultry, and goatery. All these families are now settled and have come out of the tragedy that struck their families.They are carrying out thse businesses.

6. HIFAZAT PROJECT:

This Project meaning Care is designed for the tribal children living in thestate of Jharkhand and especially in East Singbhum district. The project takes care of children that are not going

to school. The Hifazat project focuses on the lives of children and women hailing from Jharkhand. It seeks to ensure the security for every women and future of all the children in our target areas and towards their brilliant future. Our target areas include Baridih Basti, Jehratola. Parsudih, Bagunnagar, Birsanagar zone 10 n, Birasanagar zone and Bhojpur Settlement and so on..



The project aims primarily at children education. The project focuses on three different approaches; a. Prepare the unschooled children in preparatory classes so that they are admitted in school these children are below 5 years of age, b: Children who have dropped out of school for various reasons. The project teaches them and reinstates them in a school and c; Assist academically weak children so that they do better in their studies and come out with flying colours.

It also works towards instilling confidence in ladies, to make them strong financially. This is best done through the SHGs and Micro Credit program of the project. Hundreds of women are benefiting from it and their families.

Women and girls are also given 6-month tailoring course, after the completion of the training they are provided with certificates and also assisting them to start their own businesses.



The Project has also carried out number of medical camps where over a thousand persons have benefited from free medical check up. It is done with government doctors help and medicines are distributed freely to all. The cases that are dealt with are male and female and child related.

During rainy days there was a flash flood in our target area and the project has helped hundreds of families by providing them with dry ration , tarpaulin, clothes and lunch during the flood days.

7. PROJECT HAQQ (THE RIGHT):

The project Haqq is specially designed to address the needs of the Banjara community (the migrating community) in Uttar Pradesh state of India and especially. It focuses on unschooled children and their education and women empowerment of rural women in UP state. The Project is focusing on



the four districts namely Hathras, Aligarh, Mathura, and Agra. The Banjara community children are less literate but the community has various hands-on skills. So, the project is working towards educating the unschooled and the dropout children of the community. It is also forming Self Help Groups in all these four districts and creating bank linkages for the women in the community to start some business where they master the skill. The community finds a

market for the same. These members of the community are assisted to fight back for their rights and lia dignified and respectable living for themselves and their families.

The project seeks to expand its base to other Banjara communities in this state and outside whereby each family will enjoy a dignified life in the country and their migration will be restricted and stopped.



8. PROJECT NAI UMANG: This project is designed to address the needs of the Mushahaar community living in the state of Bihar. Mushahaars found in other states as well but the project is focusing on the education of the children and specially girl children who are unschooled or school drop outs. Currently the project is operation in the villages of Arrah and Nalanda districts of Bihar. Nearly 350 children are assisted in education through 5 centres that are operational. The project is take care and grooming these children, who are the bright futures of India in coming years.

9. <u>TRAINING OF SOCIAL WORKERS AND VOLUNTEERS:</u> In order to carry out the organistional objectives and aims, the organization has been training grass root workers and beneficiaries so that theyt become change agents of the community. The organization invests and works hard to see community leadership emerging and growing from grassroot lever. This will leave a lasting impact on the communities we serve and people we cater to.

All these projects and other activities have made it possible for TFGTI to reach hundreds and thousands of children, men, women, youth, and elders to empower them and bring them up from below the poverty line. Thus the motto of the organistion "ENSURING SMILE ON EVERY FACE" is achieved to the satisfaction of all.


